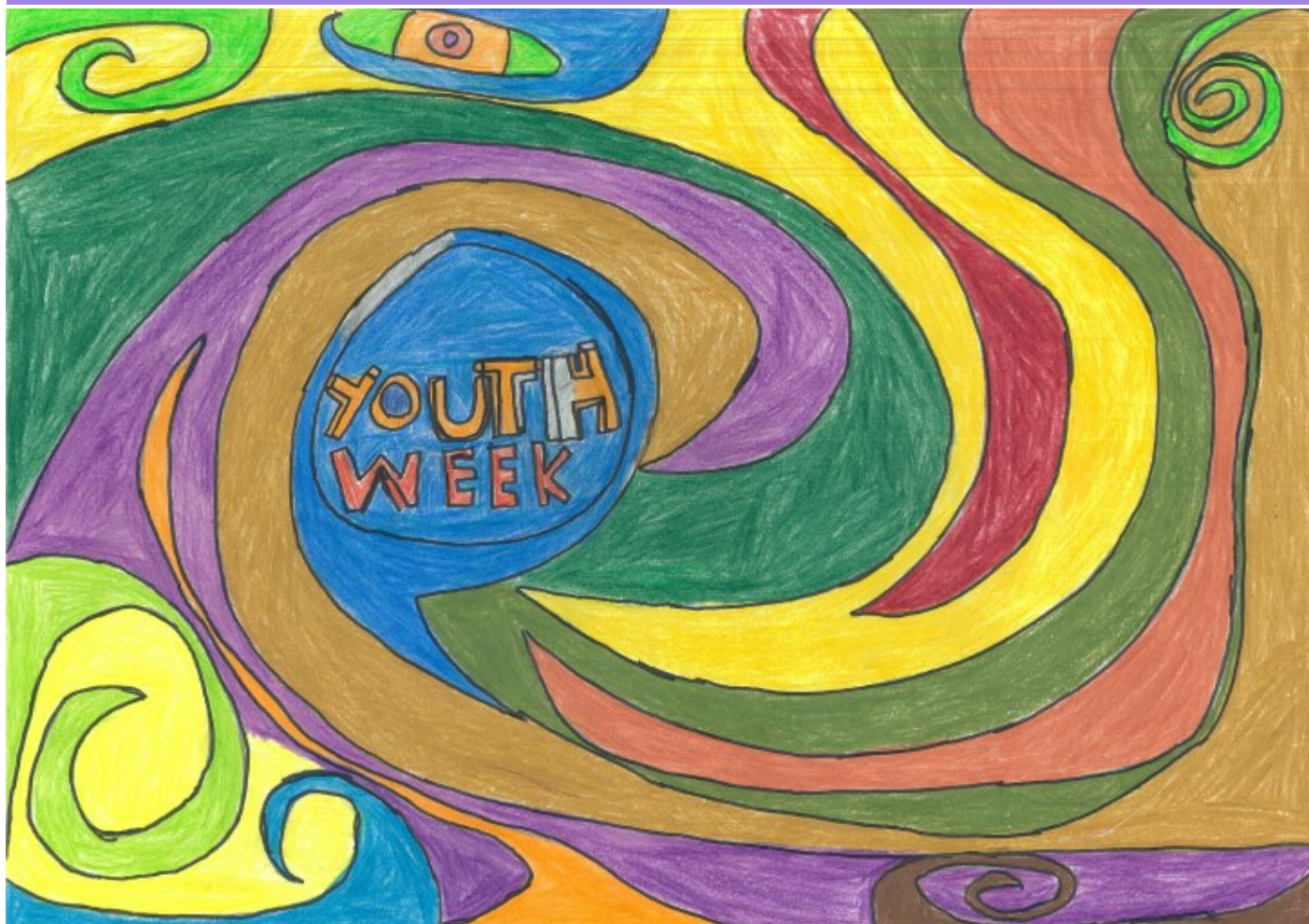

### Mikayla Macartney to compete in Australian Championship

Mikayla is the current National Open Ladies Five Stand Champion and HWMHS School Captain. She won this title last year in Shepparton so she will be defending her title. She is travelling this week, after completing her end of Preliminary Exams to Three Springs in Western Australia, which is 320 km north of Perth. Mikayla did not get into the NSW Women's team this year and she could not defend her NSW Junior Title as she was completing her Hospitality work placement in Echuca when the NSW State Championships were on.

A Five Stand event requires the shooter to hit five clay targets, that are shot out of five different cages, placed at different locations. The aim is to hit the 25 targets. At the National Championships, each person shoots four times a day and the championships rounds are held each day for three days. At the end of the third day, the winner is determined. Mikayla will travel to WA with her dad Darren who is a member of the NSW State team and has been for the past nine years.

### Young Endeavour Voyage

Congratulations to Scout Wall who has been accepted and will be participating in the Young Endeavour voyage during the upcoming school holidays. It is a fabulous opportunity to be challenged and experience life at sea. This is a great initiative by Scout to take up this opportunity.

The Young Endeavour undertakes around 20 voyages each year, mostly along the east and south coasts of Australia. It is run in partnership with the Royal Australian Navy. Well done, Scout.



### Calculators

The calculator is an essential tool in the learning of many skills and concepts in Mathematics. Instruction is given on how to use many of the functions on the calculator when learning different topics from Year 7 up to the Senior level. It is important that all students bring a calculator with them to class so that they are able to



continue with their learning in Mathematics.

I have noticed that a number of students in the Junior School do not have or bring calculators with them to their Maths lesson and as a result these students have some difficulty in doing the work that is given to them for the lesson.

If parents could ensure that their child owns a calculator to facilitate their Maths education and if your child does not own a calculator, they can be purchased from the local newsagent.

The recommended calculator that we use here at the High school is the CASIO fx-AU PLUS II, which they will use until they complete their secondary education.

## Requirements for Studying Education in NSW and Victoria

If you are interested in becoming a teacher in NSW look at the following websites

Remember to become a teacher in NSW you need to achieve a minimum standard of **three Band 5 HSC results, including one in English**, to undertake an accredited undergraduate teaching degree. Many universities have pathways for students who have not met this requirement, such as bridging courses or courses that are part of the degree. Students interested in a career as a teacher need to explore each university as they are all addressing this requirement in different ways. In **Victoria**, all students must successfully complete the CASPer online test to be admitted to a teaching course. This must be undertaken before offers are made. Universities do NOT give conditional entry to students who have not undertaken this test. To ensure consideration for Round 1 offers, you must sit CASPer by the end of November. Results from the December and January sittings will only be returned in time for Round 2 offers. Any Year 12 students considering applying for Victorian universities to complete an education degree need to thoroughly read and familiarise themselves with the CASPer site (<https://takecasper.com/>) and V-TAC Information sheet about CASPer (<http://vtac.edu.au/files/pdf/publications/CASPer.pdf>) .

Also, all teacher education students across Australia need to pass the National Literacy and Numeracy Test in order to demonstrate the personal literacy and numeracy levels expected of a prospective teacher, before they begin their final professional experience placement.

### UNE Direct Early Entry

UNE's direct entry scheme relies on the School's/TAFE's recommendation of the student, including the student's personal attributes, ability to work and learn independently as well as their overall potential for academic success at UNE. Successful Early Entry applicants will receive an offer in November. Year 12 students can start their application now and can save and go back to it before submitting. Applications close 28 September, 2018. 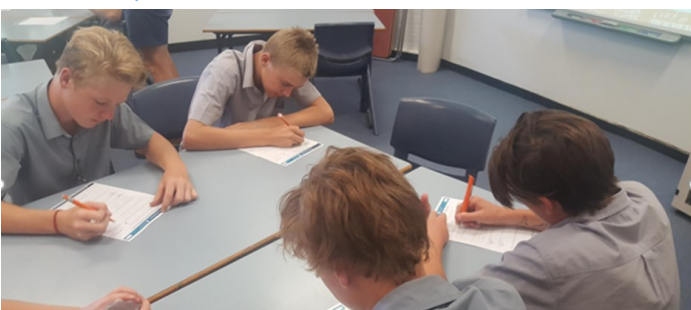

Charles Sturt University (CSU) Future Moves facilitators visited the school on Tuesday and completed workshops with all students from Year 7 to 10. Students discussed possible careers they would like, what skills they needed for particular careers and the pathway and qualifications for a variety of careers. What are your main commitments at HWMHS?

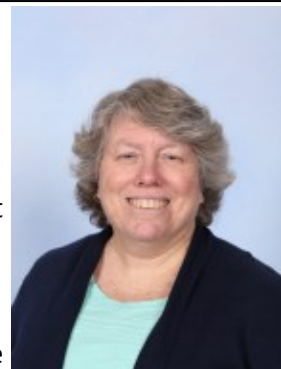
I am committed to welcoming visitors to our school and our museum, meeting student requirements and maintaining the smooth running of the front office.
