Minimum Standards for the HSC

If a student is sitting the HSC exams in or after 2020 they will need to meet a minimum standard of literacy and numeracy to receive their Higher School Certificate.

- Literacy and numeracy skills are key for success in everyday life. Achieving the HSC minimum standard means they will have a level of skills necessary for success after school.
- Students show they have met the HSC minimum standard by passing online tests of basic reading, writing and numeracy skills needed for everyday tasks. The minimum standard online tests are not based on NAPLAN.
- Students master basic skills at different stages so there are multiple opportunities available for students to understand what to expect and pass the minimum standard online tests, from Year 10 until a few years after Year 12.
- Some students will be eligible for disability provisions for the minimum standard tests, or an exemption from the HSC minimum standard requirement.

Important changes to the HSC minimum standard

From this year, Year 9 NAPLAN tests will no longer be available as an early way for students to demonstrate the standard. This change has been made to ensure NAPLAN remains focused on its diagnostic purpose and to reduce unnecessary stress on young people.

Current Year 10 students who achieved a Band 8 or above in a 2017 Year 9 NAPLAN reading, writing or numeracy test are recognised as having met the HSC minimum standard in that particular area and will not need to sit the corresponding online test. If students did not get Band 8s or above they will need to take the corresponding online tests.

Student Attendance

A reminder that school commences at 8:55am each day for our students. Students not present for their lessons are recorded as absent.

The Education Act (1990) requires parents/carers to ensure that their children of compulsory school age attend school on each day the school is open for instruction and to arrive on time unless there is an acceptable reason for them not attending. The Act also requires parents to explain their child's absences within seven days of their occurrence. Failure to do so will result in an unjustified absence being recorded.

Sometimes students are recorded as absent because they arrive late to school and do not sign in at the Front Office before going to class. If a student is late to school, it is the parent/carer's responsibility to provide an explanation to the Front Office so the official school rolls can be adjusted. If this is not done then it is assumed that the student is absent for the day.

Please ensure your child arrives to school on time every day. If your child is late please notify the Front Office with an acceptable reason for why they are late.

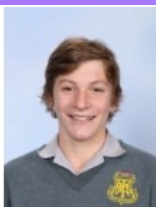

Tennis and Lawn Bowls

On Monday 7 May, students from HWMHS travelled to Barham to compete in the open boys and girls tennis as well as open lawn bowls.

The girls opened their morning with a comprehensive win over Tooleybuc winning five of their six sets. From then their day became much more challenging with losses to Deniliquin and Barham. All the girls won at least one set during the day with their best effort against Tooleybuc. Grace Weymouth and Olivia Joyce won their doubles 6-3 with Hannah Stewart and Delilah Crighton winning their doubles 6-0. Hannah won her singles 6-1, Delilah won her singles 6-2 and Olivia won her singles 6-0. Delilah also had a win in her singles match against Barham 6-3. The girls finished the round robin format in third place.

The boys were unlucky to come up against a strong and older Finley side in their first match. Possessing some Riverina representatives from last year, Finley's number one and two seeds were very strong and faced their stiffest competition of the day from our own

Riverina representative from 2017 in Kenneth Hargreaves as well as Fergus Cattnach with our boys going down 6-2. Brad Callaghan and Daniel Stewart also lost their doubles against Finley 6-5. The boys went on to prove they were easily the second best team on the day by dismantling Deniliquin, winning all six sets and five of six sets against Barham. Kenneth Hargreaves in particular needs a special mention as the Hay number one seed meant he had to play all his singles matches against the number one seed from all the other schools all of whom were senior students.

Playing 10 end matches, Hay defeated Deniliquin 13-6 in their first match. Following Barham's earlier defeat of Deniliquin, the final match between Hay and Barham would decide who progressed to the Riverina semi-final. Hay started the match strong scoring single and double shot ends in five of the first six ends. After six ends Hay had a strong 6-1 lead. Unfortunately, the boys ran out of luck and coughed up a seven shot end in the seventh turning the match on its head and giving Barham the lead. Barham took their opportunity and effectively sealed the match with a four shot end in the ninth before running out 14-6 winners. The boys are to be commended on their attitude and sportsmanship in a game they had not played a lot of.

All of the students were a pleasure to take away and they conducted themselves in a manner that the school and community would be proud of. A special mention must go to Tony Callaghan who helped keep an eye on the tennis and ensured the matches ran smoothly. The lawn bowls team would also like to thank Dave Townsend from the Hay Bowling and Golf Club for the loan of some quality bowls that allowed the students to perform consistently and remain competitive during their matches.

National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) 2018

LETTER TO PARENTS

In May 2018 the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) will be completed by students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. NAPLAN has the support of all State and Territory Education Ministers and will assess the literacy and numeracy skills of students across Australian schools.

The results of the tests will provide important information to schools about what each student can do, and will be used to support teaching and learning programs. Parents will receive a report indicating their child's level of achievement. Each student's level of achievement will be reported against the national minimum standard.

Student background information (student name, gender, date of birth, language background and Aboriginality) will be collected as part of the National Assessment Program. This information is treated confidentially and held securely to ensure that every student's right to privacy is maintained.

The NAPLAN tests will be conducted from 15-17 May 2018.

In the numeracy tests students do not require any measuring tools such as rulers or protractors. In Years 7 and 9 there will be one numeracy test with two parts: Part A calculator is allowed and Part B where calculators are not to be used. For the calculator test, the student should use the calculator that they currently use at school.

Friday 18 May – A 'catch-up' day is scheduled for students who missed a test or were absent on a test day. Students may be considered for exemption from the tests if they:

- are newly arrived in Australia (less than one year before the test) and with a language background other than English, or
- have significant intellectual disability and/or significant co-existing conditions which severely limit their capacity to participate in the tests.

All other students are expected to participate in the tests. Disability adjustments which reflect the student's normal level of support in the classroom may be provided. Large print, braille, coloured paper versions and electronic tests are available to meet the needs of individual students.

Access to disability adjustments or exemption from the tests must be discussed with the school principal and a parent or carer consent form must be signed.

Students may be withdrawn from NAPLAN by their parent or carer. This is a matter for consideration by parents in consultation with the school principal. If you wish to withdraw your child from the tests, a parent or carer consent form must be signed.

Please make an appointment with the principal of the school your child attends if you would like to discuss your child's participation in NAPLAN.

What is your favourite subject at HWMHS and why?

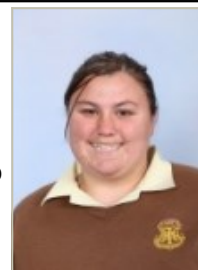
My favourite subject is Visual Design. It is a fun subject. You can make things and there is no exam!
