### New K - 10 PDHPE Syllabus

It is a very busy and exciting time for PDHPE across Australian with the new K - 10 PDHPE Syllabus now finalised. The implementation dates for Years 7 and 9 are in 2019 and K - 10 in 2020. There have been a number of Professional Learning Days across NSW that PDHPE staff have attended to become familiar with the new syllabus document so planning and mapping out for the future years can be performed.

There are extensive changes evident in the new syllabus which encourages visible and contemporary teaching and learning. The new syllabus now has three main strands as the main drive of the syllabus. These are Health, Well being and Relationships; Health, Safe and Active Lives; and Movement, Skill and Performance. To complement these key strands are 5 propositions that underpin all learning that takes place in PDHPE which are Focus on Educative Purpose, Strength Based Approach, Critical Inquiry Approach, Value Movement and Develop Health Literacy.

During Week 6 James Coleman and Dimity Comb have been given Professional Development time to further familiarize themselves with the new syllabus and map out future PDHPE teaching programs. They are very excited to be able to implement the new syllabus into Hay War Memorial High School in the coming years.
