Year 11 and 12 Construction

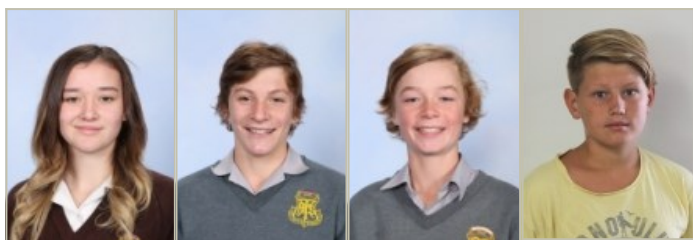

School Uniform

Hay War Memorial High School ask all parents to send their children to school neatly dressed in correct uniform. For every student, pride in personal appearance and in wearing of the school uniform is an important step in developing a good school spirit.

The P & C supports the wearing of the uniform and this is endorsed by the principal.

Multi coloured tracksuit pants are NOT part of the uniform and are unacceptable, as are sport style leggings as pants.

Students who do not meet the uniform standards may be asked to stand down from sporting activities or school representation. School uniform is a requirement for school excursions and students may be asked to remain at school to complete alternative tasks. Students will be informed if school uniform is not required for an excursion.

The Principal is available to discuss matters regarding uniforms, as well as assisting those students with financial difficulties.



Casual Work at HWMHS

Throughout the year there are times the school requires casual School Administrative and Support Staff (SASS) e.g. a School Administrative Officer, a School Learning Support Officer, a General Assistant, a Farm Assistant, etc.

At times, our current SASS undertake leave and it is handy to have casual staff on call for day-to-day work or sometimes block work.

If you are interested in being listed as casual SASS please make contact with our front office staff by bringing along your Curriculum Vitae (CV), the names of at least two people as referees, 100 points of identification and your NSW Working With Children's Check document/number for paid employment, which is purchased from the NSW RMS.

Once we have processed your details, and the NSW Department of Education has approved your details we can keep you in mind for any casual work.

Leather Shoes

All students who are studying Science, Design and Technology, Wood Technology, Metal Technology, Agriculture and Food Technology are required to wear closed in **leather shoes, with a leather tongue**. This means all Year 7 to 10 students, and most Year 11 and 12 students, need leather shoes for the Work, Health and Safety requirements to undertake the compulsory practical components of these courses. There are some shoes that look like leather but are actually vinyl; they will not protect the student's foot in the case of an accident. When purchasing new school shoes please inspect the shoes carefully, read the box and ask the retailer to find out what the shoes are made from.

Careers News Week 7, Term 2, 2018 Year 10 Subject Selection

Year 10 and Year 11 students need to be mindful of subjects they should or must study in the HSC for university study. Some subjects are prerequisites, assumed knowledge or recommended studies. Prerequisites subjects are those you must do to get into the course. No matter how good your ATAR is, you cannot get into the course without having completed this subject for the HSC. Often the universities will also have a minimum mark or band required as well. Assumed knowledge is when you have the knowledge, understanding and skills of a specific HSC course. It is highly recommended a student choose to study the subject at school if a uni says it is assumed knowledge. Recommended subjects means the university says students should do this subject as it helps students who complete the course.

Below is information about Victorian equivalent subjects, as many of our students do go to Victorian for tertiary study. It is usually Maths, English and Science school subjects that are prerequisites or assumed knowledge for university courses.

In Victoria students get a mark for each unit which is out of 50. If a course states that students need a mark of 25 in English, this equates to a Band 2 in Standard English.

I love learning new things and this helps me to keep improving.

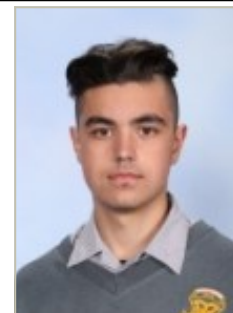
What has been your most memorable moment so far at HWMHS?
