I have been discussing with the HWMHS Student Representative Council, HWMHS P&C, Purtills Coach and staff new bell times from Term 4, Week 6 at our school. The feedback from the various consultative groups has been very positive.

### Careers News Week 6, Term 3

#### Year 10 Work Experience

This week Year 10 students were given information about the school's Work Experience Program. All Year 10 undertake work experience in Week 4, Term 4 (5-9 November). Students may do an additional week in Week 3, Term 4, if they consult with Ms McNally before organising.

Students were given the application form – the Student Placement Record, which the student, host employer, parents/carer and the school have sections to complete. Students cannot attend work experience unless this form is completed and signed off by the school. Students were also given the list of banned activities and the parent information booklet. Parents/carers you need to read these and be familiar with your role in the work experience program. Students were also given an information booklet to give their host employer.

Year 10 students need to contact a possible host employer in person or by phone, and, if they agree to host the student, then give them the Student Placement Record form and the Employer's Information booklet. Many employers will ask students to come back to collect the completed form. Once the host employer completes their section, the parent/career needs to read what the host employer has written and complete their section and then the form is return to Ms McNally at school.

#### Defence Force Work Experience

Various defence force location throughout Australia host students for work experience each year at different times of the year. The opportunities available are updated regularly throughout the year, so interested students need to check the website regularly. As with all work experience, it is the parent/carers responsibility to get the student to the location and provide accommodation.
