**Careers News Week 10, Term 3****Year 12 students Lauren Mijok and Jock Crighton Successfully complete their SBATs**

An SBAT is a School Based Apprenticeship or traineeship. It involves work in the industry, completing a TAFE course in an adult learning environment and still coming to school to achieve school academic qualifications.

Lauren has completed her SBT at the Commonwealth Bank in Hay, starting early last year. She worked one day a week at the bank and completed a Cert II in Business Services, by distance through Deniliquin TAFE. This SBT was equivalent to a school subject and she will sit the VET-Business Services HSC exam. The Hay Commonwealth Bank staff are to be thanked for supporting Lauren throughout her traineeship.

Jock has completed his SBA with Crighton's Engineering. He started this in Year 10 working one day a week and then in Year 11 and 12 worked one day and week and attended Wagga TAFE in blocks to complete the first two years of Cert III in Engineering –Mechanical trade. He will sit his VET-Metals and Engineering HSC exam. The staff at Crighton's are to be thanked for supporting Jock throughout his SBA.

Both students have successfully balanced school, work and TAFE study successfully. Thus, Lauren and Jock have completed Year 12, gained an HSC, an industry recognised qualification, learnt many employment related skills and have industry experience.

### Year 10 Work Experience

All Year 10 are to undertake work experience in week 4, Term 4. (5-9 November). There are a number of students who have yet to return their work experience forms to Ms McNally. Students who have not done so already should use the school holidays to find a host employer in a career field they are interested in and get the school placement record form completed in the holidays. All Year 10 were provided with a folder with this form and other documents for parents and employers. Year 10 were also sent, via their school email, the placement record form that the student, host employers and parents/carers need to complete before it is returned to Ms McNally at school.
