### New Bell Times from Term 4 Week 6 (Monday 19 November 2018)

As we draw closer to the new academic year – Term 4, Week 6 – we are planning some variations in the bell times. I have been discussing with the HWMHS Student Representative Council, HWMHS P&C, Purtils Coaches and staff new bell times from Term 4, Week 6 at our school. The feedback from the various consultative groups has been very positive.

The range of feedback has included that older siblings will be able to pick up younger siblings from the primary schools in the afternoons; students can go directly to class at 8:55am; most students eat more food at recess so more time will be available for them to eat and play and morning messages will be shorter and so more time will be available for learning.

There will be no reduction for time devoted to each subject. The school will continue to have a 6 period day with 50 minutes for each period.

### Hay High School War Memorial Museum Donation

He approached the HWMHS Museum about donating two collections relating to Hay soldiers. Alfred Fayle served in World War I and William Rutledge served in World Wars I and II. After consultation with the Rutledge and Fayle families, the HWMHS Museum has been happy to accept these donations to the collection.

Members of the two families, Ben Caughey, Sue Schneider, Samuel Rutledge and Michael Rutledge, were on hand to meet Lt-Col Hunter and see the collections in the High School Museum. Renewing the connections between these Hay World War I soldiers and their descendants over 100 years later is an important aspect of the Museum's role in our school and community.





### NAIDOC debating – Riverina Final

Our NAIDOC debating team travelled to Yanco Agricultural HS yesterday with Mrs Gardam for the Riverina finals. There were five teams eligible to progress to the state finals and each team had one scheduled debate in which to impress the adjudicators.

Hay War Memorial HS's team of Joseph Wilson, Gemma Tassell, Olivia Joyce and Marlee McPhellamy were listed to debate Balranald Central School. They lost the toss and were debating the negative argument of the topic: "That indigenous women are the key to closing the gap". This was a difficult case to argue but they made an extraordinarily well crafted argument which was powerful yet still respectful to the indigenous community generally and the audience in particular. The adjudicators were also impressed and Hay won this debate. These students were fabulous ambassadors for our school in this region-wide forum.

They then had the opportunity to see James Fallon HS (Albury) debate the same topic against Wagga Wagga HS. Both these teams were seniors, Year 11 and 12 students and very experienced debaters so it was a very strong debate from both sides but Wagga, like Hay also arguing the negative, was awarded the debate by the adjudicators.

Finally Griffith was successful in its debate against the hosting school, Yanco Ag. Instead of progressing to a knock out the adjudicators awarded points and Wagga was chosen as the Riverina school to go to the State finals.

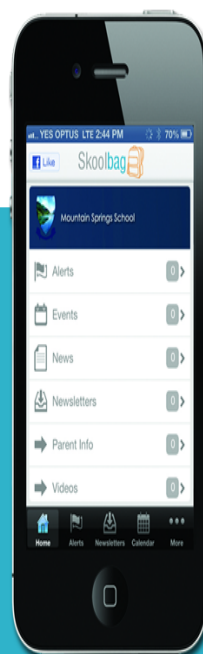

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### Change Agents Entrepreneur Program

Last week, interested students from years 7-10 participated in the Change Agents program. The program aims to develop entrepreneurship, creative and critical thinking skills, providing an insight into the exciting world of business.

Teams worked through problems in the community that they were passionate about and established the root cause before coming up with a social enterprise solution which then they pitched to a panel of judges including Mark Dowling from the Hay Council.

Ideas included "G'day Hay" - an app which aims to improve communication about local events. The team wanted more entertainment in Hay but realised through their research that there were events happening but they weren't well promoted. This idea was developed by Emma Johnston, India-Maree Edwards, Darci Masters, Ayesha Headon and Carrie-Ann Murray.

"HayFC" won the people's choice award - a local chicken fast food establishment that uses local produce, creates local jobs and aims to become an iconic tourist draw for Hay. The team recognises the perfect position of Hay as the half way point between Adelaide and Sydney. This enterprise idea was developed by Finn Cullenward, Oliver Gaston, Bradley Callaghan, Kenneth Hargreaves and Luke Nevinson.

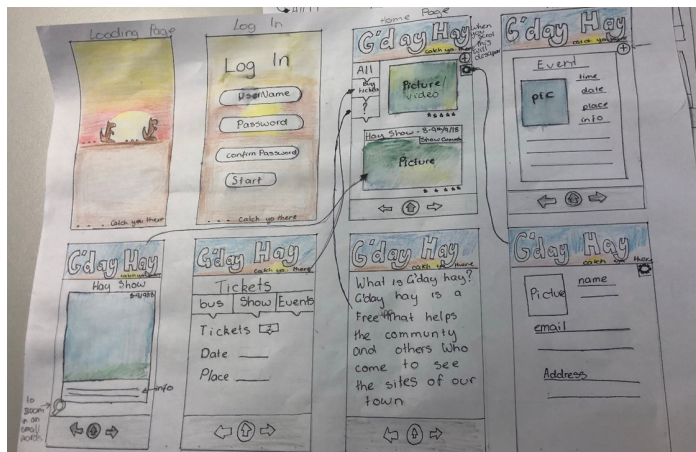
JLTD Recycling was chosen as "most likely to happen" by the Young Change Agents team with the group working on a local pickup service for cans and bottles for those who, "want to recycle but have a lot of other commitments". This group demonstrated the concept core of social enterprises – local solutions to local issues. The idea was developed by Joseph Wilson, Thomas North, Lily Masters and Daniel Stewart.

Judges choice went to "Imagination", who aim to get youth thinking outside-the-box when it comes to career options. They are looking to create a 10-town roadshow of guest speakers across creative, health science and high tech industries to inspire local youth. The judges praised the idea as "much needed in the area and a great concept". This enterprise idea was developed by Delilah Crighton, Abby-Jean Doyle, Lane Griffiths and Katie Arandt.

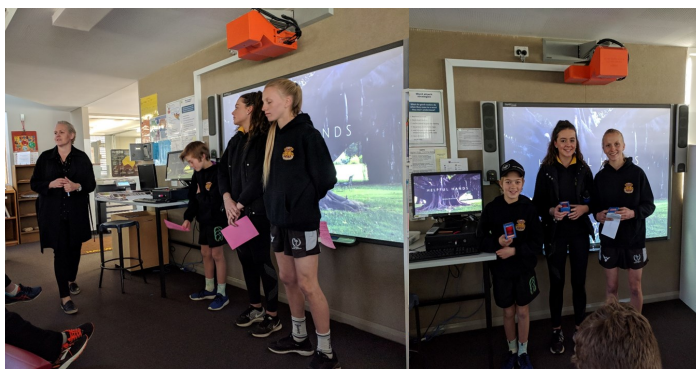
