GRIP Leadership Training (Generosity, Responsibility, Integrity, People)

On Monday 12 November our 2019 School Captains attended a GRIP Leadership Training day in Albury. Leadership training is one of the responsibilities the captains agreed to undertake when they nominated for this position. Both Monte and Hannah found the day very worthwhile and have walked away with a high level of enthusiasm for their role as leaders of HWMHS in 2019.

The conference was attended by a large number of schools from NSW and Victoria and had over 500 students participating. Students were encouraged to think about their role as leaders and to identify the importance of people in the leadership pathway and to not just think of themselves as having a position or power. We learnt about the character of a leader and were given tips on improving our core character as leaders and ways to develop school spirit. The day then had elective options and Hannah and Monte chose to do the sessions on “How to involve more people in school Events” and “How to create an amazing school culture” both of which were very inspiring and provided much stimulation for the captains to further develop for HWMHS.

Monte and Hanna were excellent ambassadors for our school and both enjoyed meeting other leaders; in particular sharing stories and working with the leaders from Finley High School. The conference provided many practical examples from other schools which helped to give the students an understanding of what is possible in our setting. The car trip home was full of conversation and brainstorming of ideas for 2019. This term the captains will meet regularly to plan for the implementation of activities and actions to develop a positive and inclusive school culture and to enhance the presence and responsibility of our school captains.



Duke of Edinburgh Adventurous Journey Murrumbidgee and Kangaroo River

During Week 5, a group of six students, accompanied by Mr Orchard and Miss Booth, undertook two adventurous canoe journeys to complete their Duke of Edinburgh requirements. The group totalled sixty kilometres of paddling along the Murrumbidgee River between Maude and Nap Nap station and then the Kangaroo River near Moss Vale.

The scenery was breathtaking, including the wildlife such as numerous kingfishers, sea eagles, wombats and even turtles. The group were prepared for the worst with storms forecast for Kangaroo Valley; however the conditions remained calm and the temperature mild throughout the trip. The students have spent the last ten weeks training for this adventure and they displayed respect for the environment, leadership and initiative throughout the expedition. Most importantly they learnt more about who they are and grew in confidence to achieve their goals.

It was a pleasure to share this journey with these students and congratulations for completing their bronze adventurous journey.
