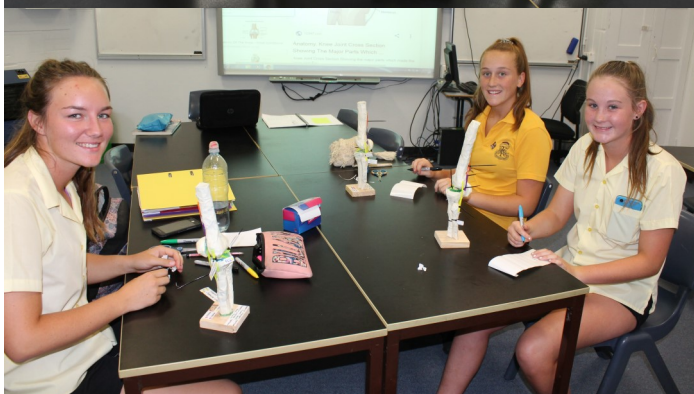
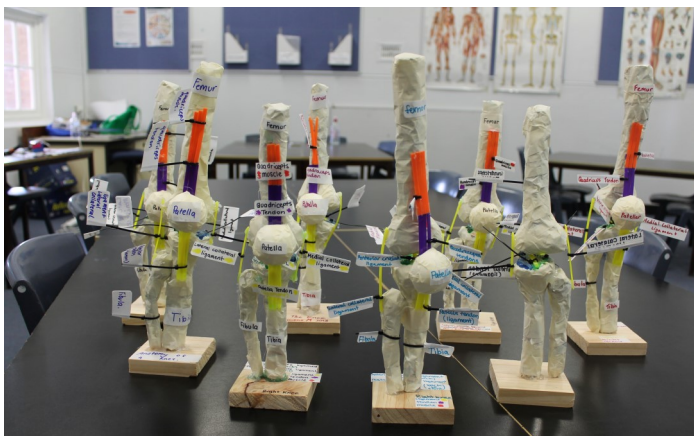
As part of PBL students positive behaviours are acknowledged with our next major reward being held in Week 10, Tuesday 18 December 2018.

A new web site has been launched with profiles of Australians working the wide variety of careers in the thoroughbred industry including strappers, horse transporters, race callers, trainers etc, as well as information on where the jobs are located. The thoroughbred industry is also from next year offering a cadetship. It is a 12 month stable and stud horsemanship program, with 12 week residential learning component of practical and theoretical training at Richmond, in outer Sydney, followed by four and a half months paid work at a racing stable and four and a half months paid work at a stud. Am I eligible for Trade Support Loans – Rural, Regional, Agriculture?

To be eligible for a Trade Support Loan you must be undertaking one of the following:

- a Certificate III or IV qualification that leads to an occupation on the [Trade Support Loans Priority List](#) (which are the same occupations as on the [National Skills Needs List](#))
- a Certificate II, III or IV in the agriculture sector
- a Certificate II, III or IV in the horticulture sector, where the apprentice is working in a rural or regional area.
