Parent Code of Conduct

A code of conduct for parents and visitors ensures that everyone who visits the school site is able to do so in a safe and harmonious manner and to ensure that students, staff, parents and other visitors are not subjected to aggressive, hostile or violent behaviours.

Parents and visitors are expected to:

- Treat all persons associated with the school with respect and courtesy
- Ensure their child/children are punctual to class
- Make appointments in advance if expecting to obtain an interview
- Allow staff to supervise, investigate and manage students without interference
- Discuss issues or concerns about the school, staff or students through the correct procedures

- Follow school procedures governing entry and behaviour on school grounds, including any restrictions that may be imposed.

Any person contravening this code of conduct is advised that the provisions of the *Inclosed Lands Protection Act (1901) and its Amendments* will be followed if any of the following occur:

- Actual physical assaults or threatened physical assaults on students, staff, parents or community members at the school or during the course of school activities including on the way to and from school;
- Behaviour in the presence of students, staff, parents or other visitors to the school that causes alarm or concern to the students, staff, parents or other visitors;
- Use of offensive language (ie swearing) in the presence of students, staff or other visitors to the school;

- Any interruption to the learning environment of the school such as entering classrooms without permission.

Under no circumstance are parents to approach another student or parent regarding any incidents or issues.

Your co-operation is sought in maintaining a safe and happy school.

Beyond the Bell

Hay War Memorial High School is committed to supporting the learning of our students. Many students benefit from expanding their fields of knowledge with access to resources that may not otherwise be available to them. To help with this, we have set up Beyond the Bell, an after school program to support student learning.

Beyond the Bell aims to provide learning enrichment opportunities including coding, robotics, creative pursuits and personalised learning projects.

Beyond the bell is coordinated by Mr Evan Hefer. At times, other teaching staff may be present to assist or deliver programs.

Beyond the Bell is held on Thursdays from 3:15—4.30 pm in the school library. All HWMHS students as well as students from Hay Public School, St Mary's Parish School, Carrathool Public School and Booligal Public School are invited to express an interest in joining the program. This can be done by contacting the school.

Students will be expected to adhere to Hay War Memorial High School's behaviour expectations. They will be required to sign in and out for each session and will not be allowed to arrive late or leave early.

Apply by March 30 with experiences throughout the year. NIDA offers courses in a wide variety of professions that are involved in the theatre, film and TV at their headquarters in Kensington, Sydney. Work experience at NIDA can be in Design (sets, costumes, lighting), Sewing, Making costumes, Making hats, shoes, Making objects (from wood, metal, plasticine, paper), Sculpting, Making puppets, Making furniture Building and constructing (carpentry, metal working), Machinery, Lighting, Sound, Stage Management, Acting (stage, screen), Singing and Dancing.

Applying to the Australian Defence Force Academy

ADFA is a unique partnership between the Australian Defence Force (ADF) and the University of New South Wales (UNSW) which provides training and education for the future leaders of the Navy, Army and Air Force. Approximately 1000 Army and Air Force officer cadets and Navy midshipmen are currently enrolled in the three year training program at ADFA. Midshipmen and Officer Cadets at ADFA begin a career in the ADF, receiving a full time salary while they undertake a program of military and leadership training. At the same time they study an undergraduate program through UNSW, fully paid for by the Australian Defence Force and are guaranteed a full time job upon graduation. Degrees that students can study at ADFA include can be in Arts, Science, Mathematics, Engineering and Cyber security. Applying for ADFA is a competitive, dual application process that can take up to 12 months. It's preferable you apply in Year 11, but you can still apply in Year 12. This term, our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: the *Tell Them From Me* student feedback survey. The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. More

than 6,300 schools in Australia and around the world have used *Tell Them From Me* to survey 5.4 million students. Capturing the voices of our students will help improve how we do things at our school.

I want to assure you that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between 11 March and 12 April. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.

A letter and opt out form and FAQs for parents/carers about the survey was sent home with students on Monday. If you **do not** want your child or children to participate, please return the form to school by **Friday, March 8, 2019**.

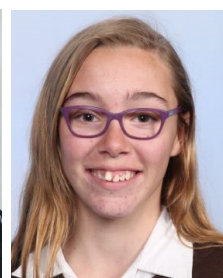
