Biology students modelled the fluid mosaic structure of the cell membrane, a phospholipid bilayer of hydrophobic tails, cholesterol and hydrophilic heads. Transporter proteins, glycoprotein receptors, adhesion proteins, etc. interspersed within or across the phospholipid bilayer.
