Careers with Ms McNally

Year 11 and 12 Students and University

On Thursday, 4th April in Periods 5 and 6 Ms McNally will be going through the process of applying for university in NSW and Victoria – two different system, early entry schemes, adjustment points, scholarship, etc. for Year 11 and 12 students wishing to go to uni after school. This session will NOT be repeated. Students need to come prepared with questions to ask. Students intending to have a gap year apply for uni when they are in Year 12, receive offer(s), accept an offer and then defer, if having a gap year. NSW and Victoria are two different systems so students can apply to both, accept offers from both and then defer both or one.

Medicine and Dentistry UCAT exam

Some institutions will require you to sit the University Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT) as part of the entry requirements. Most also include an interview. This exam is held in July each year but students need to register by May.

This is an annual five-day interactive conference designed to showcase the aerospace industry to Year 11 and 12 students from across Australia. We hope to provide students with insight into the career and training options available after high school.

Key Information:

This year the camp will run from Monday 8th to Friday 12th of July. It will be hosted at The University of Queensland, with day trips to other Universities and Industry Locations

Applications open Monday 1st of April and close Sunday the 5th of May

The forum will cost \$300, including all meals, accommodation and activities. All students stay at uni accommodation.

- A subsidy can be organised for students travelling long distances (200+ km).

Highlights from AYAF 2018:

- Presentations from lecturers at UQ, QUT and Griffith universities on a range of aviation and aerospace based topics including careers in the aerospace industry, quadcopters, rockets, scramjets, shock tunnels and UAVs
- Hands on activities such as the design, construction and launch of a model rocket, the programming of a small autonomous vehicle and introduction to electrical systems and components
- Presentations from the aerospace industry, including companies such as Raytheon, BAE Systems, Airbus Helicopters, Boeing, DST Group and the Australian Defence Force
- Tours of industry facilities, including QANTAS, Airbus Helicopters, Brisbane Airport, Aviation Australia and RAAF Base Amberley.
