The final score left Hay with 9, and Deni with 8. Well done boys, we're on to Round 3.



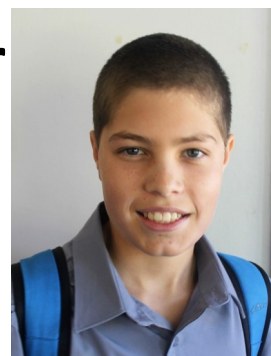

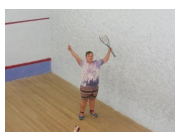
## Free Squash Development Day –
