Sydney sheep show

Below is an account from Monte Barnes and Gemma Tassell on what they got to do in the last school holidays.

On 19th April, I travelled to Sydney to compete in the RAS/ASC Meat Breeds Young Sheep Judges State Final at the Sydney Royal Easter show on the Sunday 21st April alongside 26 other competitors. I was required to judge two different breeds with one long wool and one short wool breed. Judging the Corriedale's in the long wool section I had four ewes to judge 60% on their muscle development and body structure and 40% on their wool characteristics. In the short wool section I judged four Hampshire Down rams assessing them on 100% muscle development and body structure. After judging both classes and placing both breeds in the correct order I was unfortunate to miss out on the top 7 oral presentation final by 0.5 of a mark which left me on 132 points out of 150 taking out 8th place in the state. On 15th April I was lucky enough to participate in the RAS/ASC Merino Sheep Young Judges Competition State Final, the event included 15 young men and women from across the state of NSW that had placed 1st within their group final. The event was two lots of judging, one of rams and one of ewes, each allowing 8 minutes for judging. After this aspect of judging the top 6 were selected to do a speech and from that they would be put into their respective placings. I wasn't lucky enough to make the top 6 and I am unaware of my final ranking but had a fantastic time in Sydney. It was a great experience that I hope to have the opportunity to be able to have another go at. I would also like to take this time to thank Mr Caughey and Mr Ian Lilburne for helping me to train in the lead up to the big event, and my parents for taking me to Sydney and last but not least, the Holbrook Show Society for making it possible for me to qualify. VET Industry Visits Excursion

Senior students who study one or more VET courses at school i.e. VET-Business Services, VET-Hospitality and VET-Primary Industries, received an excursion note last week, to visit related industries in Wagga. The excursion is on this Thursday, 23rd May, leaving at 8 am and returning about 6 pm. Students will visit Hutchinson and Pearce John Deere, Wagga City Council where Parks and Recreation, Health Inspection and Administration employees will address the students, RMS paperless office, Wagga Catering, Landmark and Riverina Co-op. Students must return their permission notes and \$5 to the front office by tomorrow. School to Work funding is subsidising this excursion.

Housing Industry Association Trades Day

Want to go to Uni in Victoria to study teaching? You must do the CASPER test

All applicants to initial teacher education programs in Victoria must complete the Casper test, which is a selection task assessing non-academic attributes as part of the application process.

CASPer is a tool for assessing personal attributes. Personal attributes include: motivation to teach, strong interpersonal/communication skills, willingness to learn, resilience, self-efficacy, conscientiousness, organisational and planning skills.

These are assessed through watching situational videos and then answering questions. The first date to sit this assessment this year is:

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CSU's new Alternative Entry Program – the CSU Advantage Program



This new program for alternate entry opens in June. Students in Year 12 will be able to apply for this as well as the SRS alternate entry program through UAC. Year 12 students interested in attending any CSU campus next year, even if applying and deferring, should register now at the following website.

La Trobe University offers the alternate entry Aspire program, which opens on 1st June. If strongly considering attending La Trobe Wodonga next year and applying for Aspire to attend this campus it would be very beneficial to attend. La Trobe have a number of courses where a student's completes first year at Wodonga or other smaller campuses before moving to Bendigo or Bundoora (Melbourne) campuses to complete the degree. Parents will need to organise students to attend this activity. It will not be organised as an excursion.

UAC - Access and Scholarship Programs Reminder to Year 12 Students

Schools Recommendation Schemes, Educational Access Schemes and Equity Scholarships are all open for applications. Year 12 students have been guided through how to apply for these schemes in their Thursday study period. It is pleasing that a number of Year 12 students have started their SRS (School Recommendation Scheme) applications. Due to Hay's remoteness all students who apply to uni through UAC have an automatic EAS (educational Access Scheme) application for this criteria done by UAC and do not have to actually apply for this scheme, if this is the only criteria that fits them. Students need to look at this to see if they can add other other criteria to assist them getting into uni via this alternate scheme. All students should also look at the Equity Scholarships and apply.
