Education Week 2019: Every student, every voice



This week we are busy providing opportunities for students, parents/carers and staff at our school during Education Week:

- Monday to Thursday students and staff will be learning lots of new skills on the snow slopes.
- Tuesday afternoon the teachers will be learning about “learning progressions”. The learning progressions will help teachers to ensure literacy and numeracy are taught and that the literacy and numeracy needs of students can be addressed.

- Friday parents/carers are invited to our Education Week assembly which will be held from 9:45am in the Spirit of ANZAC Centre. We will be acknowledging the commitment and ability of a number of our students and staff.

2019 school photo day

School photos will be taken on **Monday, 19 August**. Students are to wear their full school winter uniform including the brown jumper for girls and grey jumper for boys. Students received individualised photo envelopes on Friday. Students may return the envelope to the front office before photo day, with the **correct cash payment** or credit card details completed. **The school cannot provide change.** Families may put payment of all children in one envelope but all members of the family still need to return their envelopes. Year group photos are taken as well as individual photos. All students have their individual photo taken even if not purchasing as they are used for school records. Family photos are available. Students can get an envelope from Ms McNally or parents can collect a family photo envelope from the front office. If students misplace their photo envelope spares are available from Ms McNally or parents can collect from the front office. Student ID cards will be available to purchase for \$1 once photos are sent back.

Senior subject selection

All Year 10 and 11 students and their parents/carers should attend this information evening on **Tuesday, 13 August starting at 6 pm** in the Spirit of Anzac Centre. Students will be given the Course Descriptions – Subject Selection for Senior School 2019/20 booklets this week. Last week, Year 10 students participated in lessons outlining HSC choices, rules and regulations, choosing subjects and about what the ATAR is and what it is used for. Current Year 10 and 11 students need to be reading the subject descriptions and talking to teachers and students currently studying the courses they may be interested in.

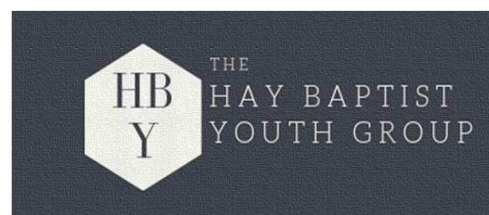
Mobile Phones
