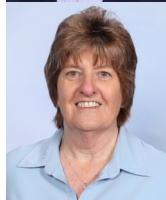
They are often the first people you see when you enter a school and are essential to maintaining positive relationships with students, parents/carers and the community.

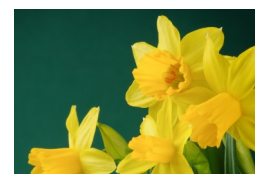

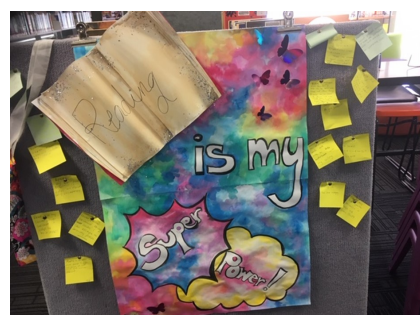
