SCHOOL CAPTAINS & SCHOOL VICE-CAPTAINS

The student leadership team of Hay War Memorial High School is a prestigious team; one, which has many, rewards as well as significant responsibilities.

Role Statement

As the most significant student leaders in the school, they are expected to be ambassadors who embody the school values of Respect, Achieve and Responsible. Our student leaders are expected to be approachable, reliable and trustworthy with high expectations of others and themselves. Characteristics the school community expects of student leaders include dedication, motivation, confidence and giving back to others. Our student leaders are to take an active role in the school community and work with others to achieve the best possible outcomes.

A member of the student leadership team is also expected to:

- Undertake the role from Term 4, Week 6 until the end of Term 4, Week 5.
- Regularly attend school, wear the school uniform, display positive behaviours and demonstrate a strong work ethic.
- Be enrolled as a full time student over their senior year.
- Participate in the Anzac Day service in Hay. The School Captains are to prepare, practise and present individually a school captain's speech for this service. Speeches are prepared in consultation with the Principal (or delegate) and the HWMHS School Council representative for Hay RSL sub-Branch to proof read and practise the speeches.
- Undertake student leadership training.
- Undertake identified formal occasions as determined by the Principal.
- Be a member of the HWMHS Student Representative Council.

Note: The student leadership team nomination process determines the two School Captains and the two School Vice-Captains. Students are applying to be a School Captain. A selection panel will determine the actual school captains and vice-captains based on the applications, speeches, votes and interviews. If there are four or less candidates, the selection panel will determine the number of captains/vice-captains based on the applications, speeches and interviews. The selection panel discusses the evidence presented by each applicant and undertake a series of voting to reach a majority consensus. In the rare event a majority consensus is not achieved through a panel voting process for a position, the Principal will then determine the final outcome for that position based on the consultative process with panel members and all evidence prior to the conclusion of the panel meeting. The Principal will notify all candidates of an outcome. Only the Principal, until announced at the Captains Induction, will know the identification of the Captains and Vice-Captains prior to the Captains Induction.
